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Modern Slavery Policy Statement

SIACO Limited is committed to the principles of the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

It shall be the duty of all clients, employees, associates and suppliers of SIACO Limited to commit their ongoing support to the same principles.

As a business that operates across the United Kingdom in a range of sectors and environments, we regularly visit the premises of other Companies and Organisations and state that we shall remain vigilant and educated to the signs of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking and know how to report such concerns quickly should they materialise.

We will not work with any client, supplier or do business with any other party which knowingly supports or is found to be involved in any form of slavery, servitude or forced labour. We will do whatever we can to safeguard our People when exposing wrongdoing.

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to:

- 1) ensure our business is working to the principles of the Modern Slavery Act 2015
- 2) demonstrate our commitment to the abolition of Modern Slavery
- 3) provide awareness to all Persons engaged with our business on our position

Scope

This policy applies to all Persons engaged with our business, including but not limited to clients, employees, associates and suppliers.

Compliance

This policy shall be reviewed annually, or earlier if deemed necessary and its implementation will be monitored regularly. Non-compliance with this policy may result in further action being taken against employees, associates and suppliers of SIACO Limited.

Our Supply Chain

Due to the nature and size of our business, we believe there is a very low risk of modern slavery in our supply chain, although we recognise that we must remain vigilant.
